FRUIT TREE NOTES: Bud 9 are dwarf and will grow 8-10 feet high. All other trees are semi-dwarf. Peach/pear/plum require some pruning and should be kept pruned to 10-12 feet. If they become too big, they will be unproductive. Trees listed as self-fertile will produce fruit, however will put forth more fruit with a pollinator. Plant 2 different varieties to ensure pollination. **All trees are bare-rooted 4'-6' and need to be planted as soon as possible.** If not planted, keep cool in moist bedding to keep roots from drying out until planted. Tree tubes and/or protectors are recommended if wildlife damage is a concern. **To help you get the best results from your trees, we suggest picking up information that will best explain proper trimming. Information will be available at pick up, and during our spring workshop in March.**

FRUIT TREES:



AMBROSIA (Bud9-Dwarf) Pollinator 4'-6' bare root \$18.00

The fruit finishes with a 50% pink to red blush over a yellow background color. The flavor is sweet and very pleasant and texture is crisp. A low-acid apple, easier to digest. Slow to brown and great in salads, baking and main dishes. Ambrosia matures late September in south central PA. Tree growth habit is compact, upright and very productive. **(8'-10' Mature Tree)**



ENTERPRISE (Co-op 30) (Bud9-Dwarf) Pollinator 4'-6' bare root \$18.00

This is a late-maturing, deep red apple with good keeping qualities. Fruit is uniform and medium to large in size. Tree is vigorous and spreading, with good annual bearing habits. Is highly resistant to fire blight and cedar apple rust. It is becoming an important processing variety. **(8'-10' Mature Tree)**



SMOKEHOUSE (Bud9-Dwarf) Pollinator 4'-6' bare root \$18.00

An old-timer welcomed in every home. Red-striped, yellow apple with tender, firm, yellowish, very juicy flesh. Very good for cooking, baking, and eating. Ripens in September and keeps well in common storage late into winter. The tree is vigorous, productive and very hardy. **(8'-10' Mature Tree)**



GOLDRUSH (Bud9-Dwarf) Pollinator 4'-6' bare root \$18.00

Best known for its remarkable keeping qualities, GoldRush will keep in regular cold storage approximately 10 or 11 months. Fruit is crisp and tart off the tree and develops its sugars in storage. GoldRush resists oxidation when cut, making a nice, yellow sauce, and the fruit also bakes very well. Tree is non-vigorous, slightly upright with a semi-spur habit. Resistant to scab and mildew. **(8'-10' Mature Tree)**



BARTLETT PEAR (OHxF87) Hardy rootstock, 4'-5' bare root. \$18.00 Needs a Pollinator.

America's favorite pear, the Bartlett variety actually came from Europe. It functions as the standard by which all other pears are measured and is a favorite for fresh eating, canning, and preserves. Starts bearing at a young age and is very productive. Fruit features a smooth, firm texture and a juicy, spicy taste. Harvest in late August. **Will pollinate Harrow Sweet**



AC HARROW SWEET PEAR (OHxF97) Hardy rootstock. 4'-6' bare root. \$18.00 Needs a Pollinator.

A late season pear that ripens about three weeks after Bartlett. Good resistance to fire blight. Fruit size and appearance are similar to Bartlett; however AC Harrow Sweet develops an attractive blush. Excellent for fresh eating and baking. Trees should be thinned to maintain fruit size and avoid biennial bearing. **Will pollinate Bartlett.**



WHITE LADY PEACH (Lovell stock) 4'-6' bare root. \$18.00

Recognized as the first important sub-acid, white-fleshed peach to be introduced in the eastern U.S., White Lady is an outstanding variety in every way. The fruit is highly colored and very firm with excellent dessert qualities. The tree is vigorous and has performed well throughout eastern production areas. **Self-fertile**



CONTENDER PEACH (Bailey Stock) 4'-6' bare root. \$18.00

This exceptionally hardy variety, perfect for northern gardens, consistently yields large crops of sweet, juicy, medium-to-large fruit. Also features lovely pink flowers that bloom and attract bees in spring. Disease-resistant to bacterial spot. Cold-hardy. Freestone. Ripens in August. **Self-fertile**



GLORIA PEACH (NJ351) (Bailey Stock) 4'-6' bare root. \$18.00


An outstanding new selection for the midseason, Gloria® is a large, highly colored, yellow-fleshed freestone peach ripening early September. The fruit is very firm, low acid, with high sugar content and excellent dessert quality. The tree is very productive and resistant to bacterial spot. **Self-fertile**



STANLEY PLUM (European variety) (Myrobalan) 4'-5' bare root. \$18.00

A fine prune-type plum with excellent quality suited for home use and processing. Fruit is large in size with dark blue skin. Flesh is greenish-yellow, juicy and fine grained. The tree is early bearing. Mid September fruit.

Considered self-fertile and a pollinator for European plums.



METHLEY PLUM (Japanese variety) (Myrobalan) 4'-5' bare root. \$18.00

An early plum with fine quality and appearance. The fruit is purple with red sweet flesh and very juicy with a distinctive flavor. **Self-fertile** and does not require another plum tree to produce fruit. One of the most frequently planted Japanese plums. July fruit.



EMPEROR FRANCIS CHERRY (Mahaleb) 3'-4' bare root. \$18.00 (Mature tree height—18 feet)

A large, high-quality yellow cherry less susceptible to cracking. The term "yellow" references the cherry flesh more than the skin, which takes on red tones. Tree is hardy, vigorous and very productive. Plant Emperor Francis cherry trees in a location where the soil drains well, in at least 6 hours of sunlight or more. Avoid areas that don't drain well after a rainfall. **Needs a pollinator— Attika or Hedelfingen work.**



HEDELINGEN CHERRY (Gisela 12) 3'-4' bare root. \$18.00 (Mature tree height— 11 to 12 feet)

Hedelfingen is a large, late-season, high-quality dark red sweet cherry. The fruit has very good flavor and lacks firmness, making it more resistant to rain cracking. The trees are early bearing, very productive and hardy. showy white flowers in spring followed by tangy cherries, tall and upright, ideal for the backyard orchard; Plant in full sun, well drained soil. **Needs a pollinator. Attika will work as a pollinator.**



ATTIKA DARK CHERRY (Mahaleb) 3'-4' bare root. \$18.00 (Mature tree height—18 feet)

Mid to late season cherry that produces abundant, long, heart-shaped dark cherries with a strong, sweet flavor. Known to resist rain-crack and damage when being transported or harvested. They require full sun and soil that is fertile and well-drained. Amend your soil with compost if necessary before planting. **Technically self-fertile, but they benefit from having another variety nearby for pollination.** Prune during the dormant season to stimulate new growth and keep a good shape.

ORNAMENTAL & SHADE TREES



INDIAN SUMMER CRABAPPLE (*Malus "Indian Summer"*) 5'-6' branched, bare-root. \$27.00

Typically matures to 15-20' tall. It is noted for its broad-rounded shape, deep rose-red flowers, followed by bright red crabapples (to 3/4" diameter) that mature in fall and persist into winter. Oval leaves emerge purplish when young, turn medium green for the remainder of the growing season and display good orange-red fall color. Good disease resistance. Grows well in a wide range of soil conditions, planted in a sunny area. Apply a simple tree fertilizer in the fall to promote new growth and flowers in the spring. Birds are attracted to the fruit.



THUNDERCLOUD FLOWER PLUM (*Prunus Cerasifera*) 4' branched, bare-root. \$35.00

When Thundercloud wakes up from winter, it bursts out with a billow of pink blossoms. When the flowers have faded, deep plum-purple leaves emerge and provide a great shading canopy. In fall, purple leaves stand in beautiful contrast to other trees. This tree grows fast, quickly shooting up to 15-25 feet. Low maintenance tree, very hardy and will thrive just about anywhere. For the best purple leaf color, plant it in full sun. Leaves will be chartreuse green if planted in too much shade.



JACK FLOWERING PEAR (*Pyrus calleryana*) 4' branched, bare-root. \$47.00

This versatile tree just loves to show off with its perfect white flowers that bud in early Spring just before hand—some dark green foliage unfurls then its foliage turns a bright yellow in fall. Renowned for being tight and upright in form, this cultivar is ideal for narrow streets and planting beneath utilities. Adaptable to many soils, prefers full sun, consistent watering until the tree is well established. Low maintenance and highly resistant to Fire Blight.



RED SUNSET MAPLE (*Acer rubrum*) NATIVE 4'-5' branched, bare root. \$41.00

Medium sized, deciduous tree. Leaves are medium to dark green above and gray green below. Excellent orange-red foliage color in fall. No serious insect or disease problems. Low maintenance, plant full sun to part shade. Has strong wood and is a vigorous, fast-grower, reaching a height of 50 feet with a spread of 25 to 35 feet, and will take on a pyramidal or oval silhouette.



CRIMSON KING MAPLE (*Acer platanoides*) Bare root 6' branched. \$50.00

Height of 35' to 45' spreading about 25' to 30' and is quite popular for purple—green foliage throughout the summer. Leaves turn brown, dark maroon or bronze in the fall before dropping. The oval to rounded crown fills with maroon-yellow flowers in the spring. Full sun—part shade, adaptable to a wide variety of soils. Pest and disease resistant.

SHADE TREES (CONT)



SWAMP WHITE OAK (*Quercus bicolor*) **Bare root 4' branched. \$43.00**

A striking tree with attractive peeling bark, especially on young trees. The lustrous, lobed leaves have a two-tone appearance, dark green on top with a silvery-white underside. Fall color is an orange-gold to yellow. An excellent shade tree for any landscape. Mature height 50' to 60'. Grows at a medium rate, with height increases of 13–24" per year. Full sun is the ideal in acidic, moist, well-drained, and wet soils. It is also drought-tolerant. Yields oblong acorns in pairs, each approximately 1" in length. This species attracts a variety of birds.



NIOBE WEeping WILLOW (*Salix alba 'Tristis'*) **4' Branched bare root, \$44.00**

A fast growing form of Weeping Willow. It has a wide spreading head with long golden-yellow, drooping branches and it likes moist areas. Showcases bright green leaves that turn yellow in fall. The large, classic weeping form is definitely displayed in this tree. Mature size is around 50'-60' tall x 50'-60' wide. Plant in full sun or partial shade at least 35 feet from your septic system or leach field. The tree's aggressive root system gravitates to water. Willows like acidic, alkaline, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, well-drained and clay soils.

****Evergreens come bundled 10 seedlings to a bundle. They are dipped in a solution to keep roots moist until you can plant them. Seedlings are typically planted by "healing" them into the soil. It is not necessary to dig a large whole. More information can be provided when you pick up your seedlings.**

EVERGREEN SEEDLINGS:**



NORWAY SPRUCE (*Picea abies*) **10 seedlings/\$10.00**

Graceful accent in your yard, or an effective windbreak. Has a characteristic pyramidal outline with upright main branches covered with pendulous secondary branches that have a pleasing "droop" to them. Grows fast (up to 2 feet/year) and provides cover/food source for wild songbirds. Strong root system withstands high winds. Plant 8-10 ft apart for a solid screen. Sun lover, tolerates a variety of soils, prefers well drained. Water during severe drought periods. Mature height 50-70 feet, 25-35 feet spread. **3 yr. seedlings - 10"-18" high, bare root.**



DOUGLAS FIR (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*) **10 seedlings/\$10.00**

Excellent demand as a Christmas tree or an ornamental. Extremely fast growth, superb needle retention and soft. 1" blue-green needles make Douglas the favorite tree for many. Prefers fertile, well-drained, light soil with full sun. Can grow 40'-60' high, spread 15'-25' in an erect pyramid in the landscape. **3 yr. seedlings - 10"-18" high, bare root.**



WHITE SPRUCE (*Picea glauca*) **10 seedlings/\$10.00**

Very hardy, compact tree with short blue-green needles. Fast rate of growth for Christmas trees. Tolerates wide variety of soils. In landscape, it is a lovely specimen tree or a sturdy option for windbreaks and buffer strips, and serves as a great visual screen. Matures to 40'-60' with a spread of 10'-20'. **3 yr seedlings —10"- 18" high, bare root.**



WHITE PINE (*Pinus strobus*) **10 seedlings/10.00**

Fast growth to 90-100 feet/spread of 25-40 feet, and excellent needle retention. Soft blue-green needles 3-5" long. Excellent ornamental tree, naturalizing, windbreak or dense screen. Desirable for Christmas trees and reforestation. Tolerates wide variety of soils. Full or partial sun. **3 yr. seedlings – 8"-12" high, bare root.**

GROUND COVER:



VINCA MINOR (*Myrtle*) Dark green ground cover with a blue-violet flower in April, grows 3"-6" tall. Spreads in a vine method from the root stem. 10-20 runners tied to form one clump. Plant clump as one unit in clean soil, free of weeds, 6"-12" apart in partial or full shade. Clump contains 10-20 runners. **Sold 50 clumps/30.00**



PACHYSANDRA (*Spurge*) Grows in sun or shade to a uniform height of 6"-12". Excellent in masses under heavy shade trees. Dense, lustrous evergreen, trailing vine-type ground cover. White flowers, March to early April. Plant 6" apart and it will give a pleasing effect immediately and in two years time form a solid ground cover. Any soil, water liberally, very hardy. **Sold 50 rooted cuttings/\$30.00**



ENGLISH IVY (*Hedera helix*) Rich dark green, glossy, three-lobed leaves make dense covering on walls, fences and ground. Thrives in any good soil and is evergreen year round. Height 6"-8" as ground cover—can climb to 90 ft as a vine. Shade, partial shade or full sun. Space 6" apart. Especially desirable beneath shrubbery. Will not climb on very smooth or glazed surfaces. **50 rooted cuttings/\$30.00**

The following trees/shrubs are available in **SEEDLINGS** which come bareroot, bundled 3 seedlings to an order. (Recommend tree tubes to aid growth and protect from wildlife)



SARGENT CRABAPPLE (*Malus Sargentii*) Native 2 year seedlings 12"-18". Sold 3 seedlings/\$13.00

This small, showy tree usually grows no more than 8 ft tall with a rounded canopy that spreads 10ft. Spring features clusters of deep pink buds that open into fragrant, white flowers, followed by deep red shiny fruit that are particularly attractive in fall when leaves fade to yellow. Fruit attracts birds and other wildlife. Plant in full sun, prefers acid rich soil with organic matter. Does not tolerate drought. Prune in spring after flowers fade.



YELLOW TWIG DOGWOOD (*Cornus sericea*) Native 2 year seedlings 12"-18". Sold 3 seedlings/\$13.00

The bright yellow stems on the younger growth of this multi-stemmed shrub provide striking winter color. White flower clusters adorn the green foliage in spring and are followed by white ornamental fruit. Bare stems are an excellent addition to seasonal flower arrangements. Deciduous shrub that can be used as borders or mass plantings. Ideal for naturalizing. Plant in moist soil that is organically rich in a full-sun to part-shade location. (Mature height 6-8 feet)



AMERICAN HAZELNUT (*Corylus Americana*) Native 3 year seedlings 24"-36". Sold 3 seedlings/\$13.00

Also known as American Filbert. Native shrub with tasty nuts prized by cooks for easy-to-crack shells and small sweet kernel. Squirrels love them as well! Hedges can be used as windbreaks, visual screens, and to attract wildlife. Grows to a height of 15'-18', spread of 10'-12' at a medium to fast rate. Full sun/partial shade in acidic, alkaline, loamy, moist, rich, sandy, well-drained and clay soils. Drought tolerant. Grows in rounded shape.



PUSSY WILLOW (*Salix discolor*) Native 3 year seedlings 24"-36". Sold 3 seedlings/\$13.00

Grown as deciduous shrubs or small trees, valued for the soft, furry catkins they bear, often while other plants are still dormant. Because the catkins appear so early, they're considered one of the first signs of spring. Flowers and leaves emerge after the catkins. Because pussy willows like moisture, they're a good choice for planting near a pond, lake or stream; in a rain garden; or to help control soil erosion. Plant away from septic tanks, sewer lines or water lines as roots can become invasive. Keep compact and shrub-like through proper pruning. Can grow 6-20 feet tall and 4 -12 feet wide if not pruned.



CAROL MOUNTAIN LAUREL (*Kalmia Latifolia*) Native Sold 1 plant in a 1 Gallon Pot / \$13.00

A compact spring blooming broadleaf evergreen shrub with lovely deep pink buds that open to showy clusters of shell pink cup-shaped flowers with white centers at the ends of the branches from mid to late spring. It has attractive dark green foliage which emerges deep purple in spring. The glossy pointy leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter. Relatively low maintenance shrub, and should only be pruned after flowering. It requires an evenly moist well-drained soil for optimal growth and can grow to be

about 6 ft tall, with a spread of 6 ft. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can live for 50 years or more. Performs well in both full sun and full shade.

BLUEBERRIES: (*Vaccinium*)

The **blueberry plants** are self fertile plants, however, for heavy fruit production we recommend purchasing two different varieties for cross pollination. Plant in acidic soil, in full sun (at least 6 hours) or partial sun. Mulch with year old mulch. (Pine preferred). New mulch depletes nitrogen and can kill young plants. Pick up information when you pick up your plants.

DUKE BLUEBERRY

(Early) A vigorous, upright bush bearing medium-sized, light-blue, firm fruit. Blooms late, avoiding early frost, but ripens relatively early. Mild flavor improves in storage. Good resistance to mummy blight, moderately resistant to anthracnose. Winter hardy. Self-pollinating. Bush height/width 4'-6". Plant in full sun. **1 Gallon pot/\$13.00**

BLUECROP BLUEBERRY

(Mid Season) High yields of medium sized, firm fruit with good flavor. Winter hardy plant with good disease resistance. Mid July fruit. Plant in full sun, 5 feet apart. **1 Gallon pot/\$13.00**

LIBERTY BLUEBERRY

(Late Season) Producing beautiful, powder blue, amply sized berries. This vigorous variety extends your harvest throughout August. Liberty's luscious berries have a firm texture and exquisite flavor just right for fresh eating. Strong, productive, vigorous plants mature to 4-6 feet tall. **1 Gallon pot/\$13.00**



BERRIES:

ALLSTAR STRAWBERRY

Fragaria vesca

A top-performing variety! This easy-care plant is highly disease-resistant, cold hardy, and very vigorous, giving you crops of large, glossy, firm berries with an exceptionally sweet taste and that perfect strawberry shape. You'll want to plant plenty of extras for freezing or making preserves. Ripens in June. **Self-pollinating. 25 crowns/\$13.00**

FLAVORFEST STRAWBERRY

Fragaria ananassa



This June bearing strawberry combines excellent flavor profile, high yields and great disease resistance. Plants produce lots of beautiful deep red, delicious berries that are large, plump and juicy! Excellent for eating fresh, frozen and in jams, jellies and pastries. Holds its size through the season. Flavorfest exhibits excellent disease resistance to red stele and crown and fruit rot diseases. Produces one large crop of berries over a few weeks time. **Self-pollinating. 25 crowns/\$13.00**

ALBION STRAWBERRY

Fragaria vesca

Everbearing variety. Produces 2-3 crops from June through October. Long, conical, symmetrical; firm fruit bursting with sweetness. Resists Verticillium wilt, Phytophthora crown rot and resistance to anthracnose crown rot. **25 crowns/\$13.00**

BRISTOL BLACK RASPBERRY

Rubus occidentalis

Best tasting black raspberry! Large, firm fruit, for fresh eating, freezing or preserves. Vigorous, upright canes do not require staking. Cold-hardy. Ripens in July. Plant in loamy, well drained soil, full sun. Space @ 3'-4' apart. Mature plant 4'-5' tall/3"-4" wide **Self-pollinating. 1 Year Rooted cuttings. 5 cuttings/\$16.00**

LATHAM RED RASPBERRY

Rubus idaeus 'Latham



A reliable favorite! Premium-quality berries have glowing pure color, plus wonderful sweet flavor. Full flavored, firm, aromatic fruit that is somewhat non-cohesive. Vigorous, highly productive. Disease resistant and cold hardy. The standard for Spring bearing red raspberries. Ripens evenly over a 3 week period. Perfect for jams and jellies. Bush 4'-6' high, space 3' apart. ELDERBERRY

Sambucus canadensis



PA native. American, or common Elderberry grows in medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Expansive, flat, white flowers give way to clusters of black elderberry fruits in late summer. The fruit can be used to make jams, jellies, pie fillings and elderberry wine. Berries have very high anthocyanin content...very good for you! **3 yr seedlings 16"-24" Sold in a bundle of 5 seedlings/\$13.00**

VEGETABLE:



JERSEY KNIGHT ASPARAGUS Superior variety, all male hybrid, high yielding, vigorous in growth, tolerant to fusarium crown and root rot, high resistance to rust. Plant in fertile, well drained soil, sunny area with a PH of 6.5-7.0. Rows should be 4 ft apart, plants 12" apart in row/open furrow 8" deep.

CRIMSON RED RHUBARB (*Rheum*) A high-quality, popular garden vegetable. Long-lived perennial that will grow up to 24 in. high with a 24 in. spread. One of the best ever for flavor. Sweet, yet agreeably tart. Produces ample yields of plump, crimson stalks. Delicious in sauces, pies and other desserts. Rich in vitamin C, fiber and other nutrients. Plant in well drained rich soil, in full sun. Best if it gets afternoon shade in the heat of summer. Fortify with compost or well-rotted manure. Do not harvest stalks the first season. **#1 division crown /\$10.00**

PERENNIAL FLOWERS

The flowers listed below are provided by Musser's Nursery and come in **3" pots**, in their **dormant** stage. New growth should appear in June. These will be sold **3 pots for \$8.00**.



BLACK-EYED SUSANS (*Rudbeckia fulgida*)

Native A very vigorous and compact variety, exceptionally bright golden daisy-like flower with brown centers, July into fall. Height and spread of 2' to 2 1/2'. Easily re-seeds and attracts wild birds, (a favorite of wild turkeys). Well drained soil, full sun. **Comes in 3" pots. 3 pots/\$8.00**



PURPLE CONEFLOWER (*Echinacea purpurea*)

Native Large, daisy-like flowers grow on sturdy stems generally 3' tall. The flower petals range in color from purple to lavender. The seed center is a large, copper colored cone, hard and prickly. Blooms all summer and into autumn. Full sun or partial shade. Prefers well drained fertile soil, but is drought tolerant. Goldfinches and other birds love to feast on the seeds in winter. **Comes in 3" pots. 3 pots/\$8.00**

ARIZONA SUN BLANKET (*Gaillardia x grandiflora*) **Native Sold 3 pots/\$16**

Compact perennial growing to a height of 10"-12", spread of 12"-18". Large brightly colored daisy-like flowers, mahogany red with bright yellow contrasting edges. Light green foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. Long blooming, July through October. It grows at a fast rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 5 years. This plant should only be grown in full sunlight. It prefers dry to average moisture levels with very well-drained soil and is drought tolerant. Good selection for planting in outdoor pots and containers. Very hardy.



GALLERY YELLOW LUPINE (*Lupinus polyphyllus*) **Native Hybrid Sold 3 pots/\$16**

Lupines are welcomed additions to beds/borders/cottage gardens where they add color, height and structure. Great in containers or as cut flowers. Vigorously grows up to 15-18 in. tall, 12-14 in wide. Short lived perennial that blooms late spring to early summer. Deadhead spent flower spikes to promote additional bloom. Will self-sow in optimum growing conditions. Performs best in full sun in rich, moderately fertile, evenly moist, well drained soils. Thrive in areas with fairly cool summers and appreciate afternoon shade in hot areas.



DARK DYNASTY BUTTERFLY BUSH (*Buddleia 'Dark Dynasty'*) **. Sold 3 pots/\$16**

A multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with a densely compact, rounded habit, growing just 3' tall and 3 1/2' wide in two years. Rich royal purple, fragrant flowers are on branched panicles from late summer into early fall, just in time to feed the migrating Monarchs passing through. This shrub should only be grown in full sun. It is very adaptable to both dry and moist locations, and should do just fine under typical garden conditions. Relatively low maintenance shrub, best pruned in late winter once the threat of extreme cold has passed.



ADOBE ORANGE CONEFLOWER (*Echinacea "Sombrero Adobe Orange"*) **Native Sold 3 pots/\$16**

An early bloomer, this coneflower enjoys a compact habit and provides a vibrant floral display from late spring to late summer. Grows in clumps up to 18-20 in. high x 22-24 in. wide. Thrives in full sun or light shade. Prefers average, dry to medium, well drained soil. Drought, deer, heat, humidity and poor soil tolerant! Remove spent flowers and cut back stems to encourage further blooms and reduce self-seeding. Attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds. If not cut back, birds will feast on cone seeds during winter.



CLOCKWISE DEEP BLUE CAMPANULA (*Campanula portenschlagiana*) **Sold 3 pots/\$16**

Charming bell-shaped, dark blue-purple flowers on a compact habit. Perfect for trailing over walls, filling spaces between larger plants or accenting rock gardens. Blooms throughout the summer and foliage is evergreen. Easy care, fast growing planted in fertile soil that is moist but well-drained in sun or partial shade. Grows 8-12 inches high x 8-10 wide. Some companion plants that work well with this better known as "bellflower" plant would be: coral bells, coneflowers and daylilies.



SOLAR ECLIPSE CORAL BELLS (*Heucherella*) **Sold 3 pots/\$16**

Rounded mounds of chocolate-brown scalloped foliage appear as though they have been outlined with green glow-in-the-dark paint. A dramatic look in part shade! An instant classic for containers and borders. Forms an expanding mound that grows 10" high. Will flower late spring into summer with strong leaf colors and great white flowers that raise up 16". Plant in half Sun / half shade to full shade in normal soil. Remove old stems of faded flowers for additional bloom and to tidy up so that the attractive foliage can be appreciated.



CRIMSON BEAUTY CREEPING PHLOX (*Phlox subulata*) **Sold 3 pots/\$16**

Red to fuchsia flowers cover this semi to evergreen perennial during spring. Longer spring flowering than many creeping phlox varieties, this phlox is a showy groundcover that works beautifully for garden borders, rock gardens, hillsides, around mailboxes, containers and as a grass substitute in smaller areas. Easy to grow. Plant in well drained soil, in full or partial sun. Grows 4-6 in. high with a spread of 12-18 inches. Shear or mow over when blooming has stopped or in late summer to stimulate growth. Drought tolerant, deer resistant, and pet friendly. For a colorful carpet pair this with Blue Emerald Creeping Phlox.



BLUE EMERALD CREEPING PHLOX (*Phlox subulata*) **Sold 3 pots/\$16**

This floriferous phlox will add beauty and color to any garden. A bevy of lavender-blue blooms appear atop the widely spreading plant in late spring. A low grower, the Phlox reaches a modest 4-6" in height, with a spread of 12-18 inches. Perfect choice for front borders, rock gardens, mixed containers and as a flowering ground cover. It does very well on slopes, eliminating the telltale signs of soil erosion, and is drought-resistant once established. Plant in well drained soil, in full or partial sun. Shear or mow over when blooming has stopped or in late summer to stimulate growth. For a colorful carpet pair this with Crimson Beauty.




