


Howells Run Stream Bank Project

The Cambria County Conservation District applied for funds to construct four streambank rehabilitation projects on the North Branch of the Little Conemaugh River and tributaries in 2013. We were awarded a grant for \$58,000 from GenOn Fine monies through the Foundation for PA Watersheds. Competitive bidding allowed for four additional stream projects to be constructed. In 2013 six projects were completed and 1 project in 2014.

The last two projects were also competitively bid in 2015 and an award for \$11,432 was made to Sody's Excavating of Hastings, PA. The total value of the two projects \$16,112 with all other matches applied. They completed the two projects on Howell's Run the first week of November. The first was Howell's Run #2 consisting of 80ft of modified mud sills, one single log deflector and two multi-log deflector for a total improved length of 134ft. The second was Howell's Run #3 consisting of three multi-log deflectors and 50ft of modified mud sill for a total improved length of 147ft. Designs were done by the PA fish and Boat Commission Stream Habitat section, who also participated in the installation process.

All these projects were completed on Cambria Somerset Authority Property above the Wilmore Dam. The stream is a stocked trout stream and is open to the public.

Respective Solutions Group, Inc. is a collaborative, non-profit organization with a mission of: "creating safe learning environments and supporting school professionals through resources that make a difference in education." With a focus on providing students with a supervised, educational and fun after school experience. Currently, Respective Solutions serve the following school districts in the Pennsylvania counties of Cambria and Clearfield: Blacklick Valley, Cambria Heights, Central Cambria, Glendale, Harmony Area and Northern Cambria. Program is free to families, and is available to any student in grades 3-8.

The Conservation District Staff was asked to preform environmental education programs for the students of these school districts. The education programs that were provided by the district were:

- Bats—a program that described the many different types of bats and the importance of bats in a ecosystem.
- Turkeys—this program described the many differences between a wild turkey and a domesticated turkey along with the different body parts of the turkey and the difference between male and female.
- Black Bear a program all about black bears and how they survive in the wild.
- The Incredible Journey this program taught the students about the amazing cycle of water.
- Reptiles and Amphibians—a fun program were the students had a chance to see the many different types of reptiles and amphibians that live in Pennsylvania and more importantly in their backyard.

The District staff enjoyed doing the programs, introducing the students to "cool things about the environment that they live in.

Retiring Board Members and Board Member Recognition

Congratulations and best wishes to three very dedicated members of our Conservation District Board of Directors. Jerome (Nixie) Carl, Clair Dumm and Robert (Bob) Ritchey.



Clair Dumm, served as a Farmer Director from 1997 through 2015 (18 years), serving many of those years as the Chairman of the board. Clair had previously been the district manager of the Conservation District for 25 years, retiring in 1996. As manager he expanded programming in the office to include new methods of conservation such as the no-till drill rental program. In 2010 he received the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation District's *Ann Rudd Saxman Conservation District Director Excellence Award*. This award is given to recognize outstanding efforts that further the activities and accomplishments of conservation districts on a statewide basis. Clair is a fourth generation farmer and remains on his century farm, enjoying his retirement with his wife Dee, and many grandchildren. Clair will remain active with the board as a non-voting Associate Director.

Jerome Carl - better known to his fellow board members as "Nixie" has been a Farmer Director for 17 years. Nixie was the chairman of our Land Use Committee and a member of the Operations/Personnel committee. He is also a member of the Farm Service Agency board, and has served as president of the Cambria County Farm Bureau. Jerome was named *Cambria County Farmer of the Year* in 1980 and in 1981 as *Pennsylvania Conservation Farmer of the Year*. Nixie remains on his family farm in Dysart with his wife Dorothy. He plans to slow down a bit on the farm, but will continue to have a say in farming operations. He has agreed to remain a vital part of the board as a non-voting Associate Director.
