## Manure Management Workshop

## Ag E&S Workshop

Pennsylvania state law requires all agricultural operations to have an Agricultural Erosion and Sedimentation Plan and all operations that produce manure to have a Manure Management Plan. Through a Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts Grant, with financial support from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection through the Clean Water Fund, CCCD has been able to provide planning workshops to local agriculture producers. Recent workshops have focused on Manure Management Plans. These plans can be completed in about a 2 hour time frame. Most individuals that attend these workshops leave with a finished plan.

Upcoming March workshops will focus on Agricultural Erosion and Sedimentation Plans (Ag E&S Plan). These plans are more detailed and require the use of a soil loss calculation. PaOneStop is a mapping platform developed by Penn State and various partners. This mapping platform also includes a soil loss calculation program. At our March Workshops, an expert on PaOneStop will be teaching attendees how to map their operation and how to use the soil loss calculation program. This is a 2 part workshop and producers must attend both parts.

## 2017 Envirothon

Teachers: You and your students are cordially invited to attend the 2017 Envirothon to be held at Disaster's Edge Environmental Education Center in the 1889 Park on Wednesday, April 26, 2017. Students currently in grades 9 through 12 are eligible to compete in this environmental competition sponsored by the Cambria County Conservation District. Each participating school may send up to 3 teams to the competition with each team consisting of 3 to 5 members. However, please note that the state rules require that we must send a 5 member team to the state event. Envirothon subjects include Wildlife, Aquatics, Forestry, Soil/Land Use, plus the 2017 Current Issue topic Agricultural Soil and Water Conservation Stewardship. The winning team will be eligible to attend the State Envirothon at the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown on May 23rd and 24th.

In preparing for this year's event, please use the State Envirothon website. For each station, the references are available under the Station Training tab at http://www.envirothonpa.org. This is the best way to prepare for the event, because it is up to date. Some of the fact sheets that you have may be out of date or no longer used as testing resources. Bird and frog call CD's are still being used for the test, so please let our office know if you need them.

Additionally, the district will have resource kits available with hands-on equipment and materials to help your students prepare for the competition this year. Our staff is also willing to meet with your teams to help them prepare. If you would like to schedule a workshop on one of the testing areas or are interested in the resource kits, email Jackie Ritko at ritko@co.cambria.pa.us, or call the office at 814-472-2120, and we will try to get the kits to as many teams as possible.
