

Cambria County's MATP ready to transition to Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority and CamTran on April 1st

Johnstown, PA- March 26, 2025. The Cambria County Commissioners announced on January 16, the award of the County's Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP) contract to Cambria County Transit Authority (CamTran) and Susquehanna Regional Transportation Authority, also known as rabbittransit. The transition to CamTran and rabbittransit will go into effect on April 1. As part of our partnership, rabbittransit has been registering MATP eligible consumers since March 1, 2025. On March 17, 2025, MATP eligible consumers began calling CamTran to schedule trips for April 1 and beyond. MATP eligible trips include non-emergency medical transportation for medical appointments and pharmacy prescriptions.

Under this partnership, rabbittransit will provide program administration guidance, while CamTran will oversee local operations and service delivery. This innovative approach will advance mobility solutions in Cambria County, ultimately creating a more accessible and efficient transportation system for our community members who rely on public transportation services.

Important information for the public

- 1. All current and new MATP consumers must complete the registration application and will be given 30 days to sign the application without service disruption upon initial trip reservation.

CamTran is planning to subcontract with the same vendors currently performing MATP trips. CamTran's goal is to fully coordinate the public transportation service, using its fixed route and shared ride bus services to operate as efficiently and effectively as possible. This will result in significant opportunities to enhance transportation services for our community. As the designated coordinator of public transit, CamTran will streamline and fully coordinate services, creating a comprehensive one-stop solution for individuals needing mobility support.
