Ombudsman Program

The Ombudsman is a trained care manager who advocates, investigates and helps to resolve complaints made by or on behalf of a resident.

A resident is an older adult living in a personal care home, nursing home, domiciliary care home, attending adult day care or receiving home and community based services.

All complaints are confidential.

Volunteer Ombudsman increase the visibility of the program by visiting facilities and residents more frequently.

Ombudsman is a Swedish word meaning "citizen representative" or one who assists in the resolution of a concern or conflict.
